Staff needs in Lodi High School are to be determined according to student enrollment in courses offered. Those needs for each succeeding school year will be based on student pre-registration in courses. Pre-registration will be completed by the first day of school in March. The recommended range system that follows will be utilized in determining class sizes. In multiple-sectioned courses there will be a sufficient number of sections to accommodate the total number allowed in the range for one section. The sections of each course shall be as nearly equal in size as is practicable. If pre-registration on the first school day in March is below the minimum number specified in the range for any given course, that course will not be offered during the next school year. During initial scheduling the range limits for any given course may be exceeded on either end by up to three (3) students. The individual ranges may further be exceeded after the March scheduling deadline by consent of instructor, counselor, and administrator. The lower limit may be exceeded in the cases of courses being offered for the first or second time or if the administration and school board determine that a particular course should be offered.

The individual ranges may further be exceeded after the March scheduling deadline by consent of administrator.

Staff needs determinations for each succeeding school year will be based on the actual enrollments on the 1st school day in March. If the top of the range for a given grade level will be exceeded, administration may recommend additional staff to the Board of Education. Conversely, if the bottom of the range will be exceeded, a staff layoff will be considered.

*The range for a given grade level may at the discretion of the Board be exceeded on either end by up to the equivalent of two students per section if it can be clearly demonstrated that the succeeding grade level

will once again be within the range.
