Review of Facility Study Information – Board Facility Review Process:

Mr. Pursell reviewed the timeline:

March 2016: Narrow 11 options down to 4 April 2016: Narrow 4 options to 1 option

May/June 2016: Board of Education Votes on Option June/August 2016: Board develops resolution/plan August/September 2016: Board adopts resolution

November 2016: Referendum vote

Mr. Pursell also reviewed some of the background on doing a referendum.

May- August: Community networking

Plunket Raysich Architects – Update:

Mr. Pursell reviewed the new options:

Option H-A Eliminates the Primary and Elementary schools and builds one new school that houses EC, 4K, K and 1st-4th grades.

Option H-B: Eliminates the Primary School and builds a new building to house existing students, including EC, 4K, K and OSC.

Option I: Eliminates the Primary School and reconfigures the Elementary School to house EC, 4K, K, 1st and 2nd grades. Reconfigures the Middle School to house grades 3-5 and OSC. Reconfigures the High School to house grades 6-12.

The cost for repairs in the district are included such as parking lots, tennis courts, roofing, etc.
